BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ROTTERDAM

SECTION 1. Local Law No. Five (5) of the Year 2001 which enacted the Official Zoning Map of the Town of Rotterdam is amended as follows:

The zoning district classification of Tax Map No. 58.9-2-5, located on the north side of Evans Road directly south of the Lands N/F of Miscellaneous Iron Fabricators in Rotterdam, NY, is hereby changed from Light Industrial (I-1) to Retail Business (B-1) to allow for the construction of a two family residence.

SECTION 2. The Official Zoning Map is amended to reflect said change of zoning district classification.

SECTION 3. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State as required by Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and by posting of appropriate signage.
