Section 1. Authority

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the authority of chapter 365 of the Laws of 1976 which added a new subparagraph (3) to paragraph d of subdivision 1 of section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law authorizing towns to adopt a local law which amends or supercedes any provision of the Town Law in relation to the property, affairs or government of the Town or in relation to any of the other enumerated subject matters in such section 10, unless there is a state legislative restriction on such amendment or supercession.

Section 2. Purpose and Findings

This Local Law is enacted as Local Law 1 - 2003, adopted as part of the Code of the Town, and more particularly, section 112 of the Code, which provides for Taxation Law within the Town. The Town Board has determined reductions of taxes for real property owners over the age of 65 based on Annual Income. The Board has determined that an amendment of these income levels and percentages is appropriate.

Section 112-1.B (4) of the Town Code is hereby amended as follows:

\$21,500	50%
\$21,500 - 22,500	45%

\$24,500 - 25,400	30%
\$25,400 - 26,300	25%
\$26,300 - 27,200	20%
\$27,200 - 28,100	15%
\$28,100 - 29,000	10%
\$29,000 - 29,900	5%

Section 4. Validity

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Schaghticoke hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 5. Repeal

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

A local law Parking Regulations During Winter Months

Section 1. Authority

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the authority of chapter 365 of the Laws of 1976 which added a new subparagraph (3) to paragraph d of subdivision 1 of section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law authorizing towns to adopt a local law which amends or supercedes any provision of the Town Law in relation to the property, affairs or government of the Town or in relation to any of the other enumerated subject matters in such section 10, unless there is a state legislative restriction on such amendment or supercession.

Section 2. Purpose and Findings

This Local Law is enacted as Local Law 2 - 2003, adopted as part of the Code of the Town, and more particularly, section 116 of the Code, which provides for Vehicle and Traffic Law within the Town. The Town Board has determined that there exists in the Town of Schaghticoke a situation in that during winter months on-street parking needs to be regulated to allow for proper snow removal without damage to residents' vehicles, or delay to the Town's ability to make said streets passable. The Board has determined that a regulation on parking during the winter months is appropriate.

Section 3.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to create a chapter as follows:

Chapter 116 Vehicles and Traffic

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-1 as follows:

Section 116-1. Establishment and implementation

Emergency parking regulations shall be declared and implemented by the Town Supervisor.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-2 as follows:

Section 116-2. Winter Parking Restriction

Parking shall be restricted on Town and county highways from November 1 to April 1 of the calendar year on an odd/even side of the street basis as follows:

- A. Beginning at 7:00 a.m. on odd calendar days, parking shall be allowed only on the side of the street with odd numbered houses to 7:00 a.m. on the following day, such that on even calendar days, parking shall be allowed only on the side of the street with even-numbered houses from 7:00 a.m. on even calendar days to 7:00 a.m. the following day.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-3, as follows:

Section 116-3 Determination of odd/even sides of streets

- A. The west side of streets running north to south and the south side of streets running east to west are hereby designated the odd side of those streets.
- B. The east side of streets running north to south and the north side of streets running east to west are hereby designated the even side of those streets.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-4, as follows:

Section 116-4 Penalties for offenses

When any vehicle is parked on any road in violation of section 116-2 of this article, said vehicle is subject to removal by towing. All towing and storage fees and expenses shall be the responsibility of the owner of the towed vehicle.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-5, as follows:

Section 116-5 Enforcement

The Highway Superintendent and the Code Enforcement Officer and their designees are hereby authorized to identify vehicles in violation of this Local Law and to engage the services of the reputable towing agency for the towing and storage of said vehicles.

Section 116 of the Town Code is hereby amended to include a new section 116-6, as follows:

Section 116-6 Definitions

The words and phrases used in this article shall, for the purpose of this article, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

Section 4. Validity

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Schaghticoke hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

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3. (Final adoption by referendum.)
