WHEREAS, the Village received a Petition to annex certain territory from the Town of Starkey to the Village of Dundee, and

WHEREAS, The Village of Dundee and the Town of Starkey held a joint public hearing on July 08, 2003; and

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Starkey passed Resolution #30-2003 to accept the petition for annexation; and

WHEREAS, The Village Board of the Village of Dundee passed Resolution # 2003-15 to accept the petition for annexation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law 714, the Village of Dundee wishes to accept the annexation of the Territory by Local Law; and

WHEREAS, the Territory is contiguous to certain real property in the Village of Dundee which is in the R-1 Low Density Residential zoning district.

BE IT ENACTED by the Village of Dundee as follows:

Section 1. The Territory, as described in Schedule " A, " attached hereto and intending to convey 6.088 acres according to the survey map prepared by Denkenberger & Greene dated September 13, 2002, is hereby annexed from the Town of Starkey to the Village of Dundee.

Section 2. The Territory is zoned R-1 Low Density Residential.

Section 3. Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

SCHEDULE "A"

ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND, situate in the Town of Starkey, County of Yates, bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the South line of the Village of Dundee and the North line of the Town of Starkey where the same intersects the West line of lands now or formerly of Consolidated Railroad Corp;

THENCE RUNNING South $04^{\circ}-53'-30''$ E, along lands of said Consolidated Railroad Corp., a distance of 426.61 feet to an iron pin;

THENCE RUNNING North $82^{\circ}-41'-02''$ W, along lands now or formerly of Rogers, a distance of 392.38 feet to an iron pin;

THENCE RUNNING North $82^{\circ}-38'-25''$ W, along lands now or formerly of Rogers, a distance of 253.76 feet to a 48" oak tree;

THENCE RUNNING North $07^{\circ}-22'-13''$ E, along lands now or formerly of Bowers, a distance of 344.08 feet to an iron pin;

THENCE RUNNING North $82^{\circ}-11'-46''$ W, a distance of 198.35 feet to a point in the centerline of Edwina Street;

THENCE RUNNING North $29^{\circ}-03'-04''$ E, along the centerline of Edwina Street, a distance of 82.80 feet to a point;

THENCE RUNNING South $82^{\circ}-47'-50''$ E, 168.25 feet to an iron pin;

THENCE RUNNING South $07^{\circ}-43'-30''$ W, a distance of 4.69 feet to a point;

THENCE RUNNING South $82^{\circ}-31'-20''$ E, along the line between the Village of Dundee and the Town of Starkey, a distance of 555.06 feet to the point and place of beginning.

Intending to convey 6.088 acres according to the survey map prepared by Denkenberger & Greene, Order No. E99-8, dated 5-14-99, revised on 11-28-00 and 09-13-02.
