Local Law Increasing the Penalty for Overnight Parking Violations
and All Other Parking Violations and Establishing a
Local Law Regulating Parking Within 15 Feet of a Fire Hydrant and
Setting Fines for Violations Thereof.

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dolgeville, Herkimer and Fulton counties, New York, as follows:

Section 1. Violations of Section 10-37 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Dolgeville, which prohibits all night parking, shall be punishable by a fine for each such violation as follows: \$20.00 if paid within 48 hours of the issuance of the ticket; \$25.00 if paid after 48 hours but within 7 days of the issuance of the ticket; \$40.00 if paid thereafter. The Village of Dolgeville has the discretion to have vehicles towed to Village impound area at owner's expense, plus charge a storage fee of \$5.00 per day.

Section 2. The fine for parking in a handicapped zone shall be punishable as follows: \$25.00 is paid within 48 hours of the issuance of the ticket; \$30.00 if paid after 48 hours but within 7 days of the issuance of the ticket; \$40.00 if paid thereafter. The Village of Dolgeville has the discretion to have vehicles towed to the Village impound area at owner's expense, plus charge a storage fee of \$5.00 per day.

Section 3. Violations of any other parking ordinance, local law or resolution of the Village of Dolgeville shall be punishable as follows: \$10.00 if paid within 48 hours of the issuance of the ticket; \$15.00 if paid after 48 hours but within 7 days of the issuance of the ticket; \$20.00 if paid thereafter.

Section 4. Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to add the following:

Article V. Fire Hydrants

- (a) No persons shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant except when such vehicle is attended by a licensed operator or chauffeur who is seated in the front seat and who can immediately move such vehicle in case of emergency, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.
- (b) The fine for parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant shall be punishable as follows: \$25.00 if paid within 48 hours of the issuance of the ticket; \$30.00 if paid after 48 hours but within 7 days of the issuance of the ticket; \$40.00 if paid thereafter. The Village of Dolgeville has the discretion to have vehicles towed to Village impound area at owners expense, plus charge a storage fee of \$5.00 per day.

Section 5. The fines, as above described, shall be paid to the officer in charge at Police Headquarters or to the Village Clerk.

Section 6. All prior laws, ordinances, rules and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This local law shall take effect immediately.
