Section 1. Chapter 177 of the Code of the Village of Deferiet is amended, in part as follows:

A) § 177-22, Schedule IV: Stop Intersections, is amended to read as follows:

§ 177-22. Schedule IV: Stop Intersections.

In accordance with the provisions of § 177-9, the following described intersections are hereby designated as stop intersections, and stop signs shall be installed as follows:

Stop Sign on	Direction of Travel	At Intersection of
Anderson Avenue	South	Riverside Drive
Apartment Drive North (Champion International Parking Lot)	South	Anderson Avenue

B) § 177-10 a is added to read as follows:

§ 177-10 a One-Way streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VIII (§ 177-26), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated.

C) § 177-26. Schedule VIII One-Way Streets is added to

read as follows:

§ 177-26. Schedule VIII: One-Way Streets.

In accordance with the provisions of § 177-10 a, the following described streets or parts thereof are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated:

Stop Sign on	Direction of Travel	At Intersection of
Regis Drive	East	Between the Intersections of Regis Drive with Anderson Avenue and Riverside Drive

Section 2. Upon the effective date of this Local Law, as provided in Sections 1-7 and 18 of the Code of the Village of Deferiet, the Village Clerk shall amend the Code of the Village of Deferiet to reflect the adoption of this Local Law.

Section 3. This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Such local law was subject to permissive referendum and no valid petition requesting such referendum was filed as of 19, in accordance with the applicable provisions of law. * Elective Chief Executive Officer means or includes the chief executive officer of a county elected on a county-wide basis or, if there be none, the chairperson of the county legislative body, the mayor of a city or village, or the supervisor of a town where such officer is vested with the power to approve or veto local laws or ordinances.

5. (City local law concerning Charter revision proposed by petition.)

I hereby certify that the local law annexed hereto, designated as local law No. of 19.... of the City of having been submitted to referendum pursuant to the provisions of section (36)(37) of the Municipal Home Rule Law, and having received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of such city voting thereon at the (special)(general) election held on 19...., became operative.

6. (County local law concerning adoption of Charter.)

I hereby certify that the local law annexed hereto, designated as local law No. of 19.... of the County of State of New York, having been submitted to the electors at the General Election of November 19...., pursuant to subdivisions 5 and 7 of section 33 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, and having received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the cities of said county as a unit and a majority of the qualified electors of the towns of said county considered as a unit voting at said general election, became operative.
