Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the intention of the Board of Trustees to enact Section 237-1 through Section 237-88 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code of the Village of Westbury and to revoke Section 46-1 through Section 46-75 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code of the Village of Westbury in connection with the revision and amendment of the Traffic Code.

Section 2.

A. Enactment of §237-1 through §237-88 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code.

Sections 237-1 through 237-88 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code of the Village of Westbury are hereby enacted. A copy of the new Vehicle and Traffic Law is attached.

B. Revocation of §46-1 through §46-75 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code

Sections 46-1 through 46-75 of the Vehicle and Traffic Code of the Village of Westbury are hereby revoked.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section or provision of this local law shall be adjudged to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate any other part of this local law, or the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the section or provision or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC

ARTICLE I
General Provisions

§ 237-1. Definitions.

A. The words and phrases used in this chapter shall, for the purposes of this chapter, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

B. The following words and phrases, which are not defined by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section for the purposes of this chapter:

CURBLINE -- The lateral line of a curb nearest to the street or highway of a curb, the lateral boundary line of the roadway.

HOLIDAYS -- New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day or as established from time to time by New York State Law .

OFFICIAL TIME STANDARD -- Whenever certain hours are named herein or on traffic control devices, they shall mean the time standard which is in current use in this state.

PARKING METER -- Includes any mechanical device or meter not inconsistent with this chapter placed or erected for the regulation of parking by authority of this article.

PARKING METER SPACE -- Any space within a parking meter zone adjacent to a parking meter and which is duly designated for the parking of a single vehicle by lines painted or otherwise durably marked on the curb or on the surface of the street or adjacent to or adjoining the parking meters.

PARKING METER ZONE -- Includes any street, parking field or portion thereof upon which parking meters are installed and in operation.

§ 237-2. Authority to install traffic control devices.

The Superintendent of Public Works shall install and maintain traffic control devices when and as required under the provisions

of this chapter, to make effective the provisions of this chapter, and may install and maintain such additional traffic control devices as he may deem necessary to regulate, warn or guide traffic under the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, subject to the provisions of § 1682 and § 1684 of that law.

§ 237-3. Schedules; adoption of regulations.

A. For the purpose of maintaining an accurate record of all regulations adopted under the provisions of this chapter, there is hereby established a system of schedules, appearing as Article VIII of this chapter, in which shall be entered all regulations after adoption. Such schedules shall be deemed a part of the section to which they refer. All regulations shall be adopted with reference to the appropriate schedule as indicated in the various sections of this chapter.

B. Regulations shall be adopted by the Board of Trustees in accordance with provisions of the Village Law and the Vehicle and Traffic Law, or by an officer or agency authorized by the Board of Trustees to adopt regulations pursuant to § 1603 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

ARTICLE II
Traffic Regulations

§ 237-4. Traffic control signals.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated at the intersection of those streets described in Schedule I (§ 237-67), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-5. Speed limits.

The speed limit for both directions of traffic along the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule II (§ 237-68), attached to and made a part of this chapter, is hereby established at the rate of speed indicated.

§ 237-6. School speed limits.

No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of that indicated in Schedule III (§ 237-69), attached to and made a part of this chapter, in the areas described in said schedule, during school days between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

§ 237-7. One-way streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule IV (§ 237-70), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated.

§ 237-8. Prohibited turns at intersections.

No person shall make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the locations described in Schedule VI (§ 237-71), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-9. Prohibited right turns on red signal.

No person shall make a right turn when facing a steady red signal (stop indication) at any of the locations described in Schedule VII (§ 237-72), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-10. Through streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VIII (§ 237-73), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as through streets. Traffic control devices shall be installed on each street intersecting the through street.

§ 237-11. Stop intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule IX (§ 237-74), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided therein.

§ 237-12. Yield intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule X (§ 237-75), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as yield intersections. Yield signs shall be installed as provided therein.

§ 237-13. Trucks over certain weights excluded.

Trucks in excess of the weights indicated are hereby excluded from the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XI (§ 237-76), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except for repair, construction, service or pickup or delivery of materials on such streets.

ARTICLE III
Parking, Standing and Stopping

§ 237-14. Application of Article.

The provisions of this Article shall apply except when it is necessary to stop, stand or park a vehicle to avoid contact with other vehicles or pedestrians or in compliance with the directions of a police officer, school crossing guard or official traffic control device.

§ 237-15. All-night truck parking.

A. No person shall park a bus, school bus, recreational vehicle-camper, truck, tractor, trailer, tractor-trailer combination or commercial vehicle upon any street or public highway within the village between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. of any day.

B. No person, company, corporation, association or other business entity shall park any commercially registered vehicle or permit the same to stand on any Municipal Parking Lot of the Incorporated Village of Westbury for a period of time longer than one hour between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. of any day.

§ 237-16. Stopping, standing and parking restricted.

Except when necessary to avoid contact with other vehicles or pedestrians or when in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer, school crossing guard or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle:

A. On the roadway side of any other vehicle stopped, standing or parked at the edge or curb of a street, also called double parking.

B. On a sidewalk.

C. Except when permitted by official signs or parking meters within an intersection on the side of a street or highway opposite another street or highway which intersects and does not cross such highway.

D. On a crosswalk.

E. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a

safety zone, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

F. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

G. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel, unless otherwise indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

H. On any railroad tracks.

I. In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers, except in an emergency.

J. On a state expressway, parkway, highway or state interstate route highway, including the entrances thereto and exits therefrom which are a part thereof, except in an emergency.

K. Engaged in the retail sale of frozen desserts, as that term is defined in Subdivision 37 of § 375 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, directly to pedestrians on any highway having a speed limit in excess of 35 miles per hour. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit the operator of such vehicle from stopping such vehicle off such highway, in a safe manner, for the sole purpose of delivering such retail product directly to the residence of a consumer or to the business address of a customer of such retailer.

§ 237-17. Additional standing and parking restrictions.

It shall be unlawful to stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the time necessary to pick up or discharge a passenger or passengers:

A. In front of a public or private driveway.

B. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

C. Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop or yield sign or traffic control signal located at the side of the roadway, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

D. Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and, when on the side of the street opposite to the

entrance of any fire station, within 75 feet of said entrance, when properly sign posted, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

E. Alongside or obstructing a curb area which has been cut down, lowered or constructed so as to provide accessibility to the sidewalk.

§ 237-18. Parking near railroad crossings restricted.

No person shall park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

§ 237-19. Obstruction of fire hydrants prohibited.

No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within 15 feet of a fire hydrant except when such vehicle is attended by a licensed operator or chauffeur who is seated in the front seat and who can immediately move such vehicle in case of emergency, unless a different distance is indicated by official signs, markings or parking meters.

§ 237-20. Unlawful moving of vehicles into prohibited areas prohibited.

No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any prohibited area or away from a curb such distance as is unlawful.

§ 237-21. Handicapped parking.

A. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this chapter for any person to stop, stand or park a vehicle in any area in the village designated as a place for handicapped parking unless the vehicle bears a permit issued under § 1203-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, and being used for transportation of a handicapped person.

B. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this chapter for any person to stop, stand or park a vehicle in a space clearly marked for use by handicapped persons in a shopping center or facility with at least five separate retail stores and at least 20

off-street parking spaces which are provided for use by the shopping public, in accordance with § 1203-c of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law without a special municipal parking permit or whose vehicle is not registered in accordance with § 404-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law.

C. A violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of \$100 for a first offense and fine of \$200 for a second and each subsequent offense, each or all of which offenses are committed within a period of two years within the village.

§ 237-22. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XII (§ 237-77), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-23. No stopping.

No person shall stop a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XII (§ 237-77), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-24. No standing.

No person shall stand a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XII (§ 237-77), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-25. Parking prohibited certain hours.

No person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified in Schedule XIII (§ 237-80) of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said schedule, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-26. Alternate side parking and tow away zones.

A. No person shall park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, but may stop or stand temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers, on any street designated in Schedule XVI (§ 237-81) as follows:

(1) On Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays on that side of the street having buildings thereon that are designated by

odd-numbered street addresses.

(2) On Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays on that side of the street having buildings thereon that are designated by even-numbered street addresses.

B. Notice of the applicability of alternate-side parking regulations shall be given by appropriate signs to be posted by the Department of Public Works.

C. No person shall park, stop or stand a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XIII (~237-78) and any vehicle parked, stopped or standing may be towed by an authorized towing company at owner/operator's expense under the direction of the superintendent or assistant superintendent of public works or parking enforcement personnel.

§ 237-27. No stopping certain hours.

No person shall stop a vehicle during the times specified in Schedule XVII (§ 237-82) of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said schedule, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-28. No standing certain hours.

No person shall stand a vehicle during the times specified in Schedule XVIII (§ 237-83) of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said schedule, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-29. Time limit parking.

No person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time limit shown in Schedule XIX (§ 237-84) at any time between the hours listed in said schedule of any day, unless otherwise indicated, upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said schedule, attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 237-30. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XX (§ 237-85), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except at the angle designated and only within the painted stall lines. On all streets or portions thereof

where angle parking is now or shall hereafter be authorized, all vehicles parked thereon shall be parked with the front thereof nearest the curb.

§ 237-31. Loading zones.

The locations described in Schedule XXI (§ 237-86), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as loading zones. In such zones, the parking of all vehicles, except trucks engaged in unloading merchandise for less than 10 minutes, is prohibited.

§ 237-32. Taxi stands.

The locations described in Schedule XXII (§ 237-87), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as taxi stands.

§ 237-33. Bus stops.

The locations described in Schedule XXIII (§ 237-88), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as bus stops.

ARTICLE IV
Parking Permits

§ 237-34. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

LICENSED VEHICLE:

A. A vehicle:

(1) For which a permit, of current validity, has been duly issued by the Village Clerk in accordance with the provisions of this article; and

(2) Which displays the said permit upon that part of the vehicle and in the manner designated by the license.

B. No vehicle shall be a licensed vehicle for the purposes of this article unless both requirements of this section are complied with.

§ 237-35. Permits.

A. Any resident of this village may obtain, from the Village Clerk, a commuter parking license for any passenger motor vehicle with non commercial plates, not including a taxicab or omnibus, of which he is the owner, by filing with the Clerk an application in such form as the Clerk shall provide and paying the required fee. Such permit shall not be assignable or transferable to any other vehicle, or to any other owner, and shall be valid only so long as the vehicle is owned by the same owner and said owner remains a resident of the village and the vehicle remains registered at an address within the Village of Westbury. Each such permit shall be valid for no more than one calendar year commencing January 3 and extending through the following January 2, and shall bear upon it the year in which its validity commences.

B. Any Employee or Business Owner of a Business located in a Business or Industrial Zone of this village may obtain, from the Village Clerk, a business parking license for any passenger motor vehicle with non commercial plates, not including a taxicab or omnibus, of which he is the owner, by filing with the Clerk an application in such form as the Clerk shall provide and paying the required fee. Such permit shall not be assignable or transferable to any other vehicle, or to any other owner, and shall be valid only so long as the vehicle is owned by the same owner and said owner continues to either own a business or be an employee of a business located within a business or industrial zone in the Village of Westbury. Each such permit shall be valid for no more than one calendar year commencing January 3 and extending through the following January 2, and shall bear upon it the year in which its validity commences.

C. Replacement. When the owner of a licensed vehicle sells, destroys or otherwise disposes of the licensed vehicle, a new permit may be issued for another vehicle for the balance of the permit year, at a fee to be set by the Village Board, under the following conditions:

(1) The registration of the licensed motor vehicle shall have been transferred to the replacement vehicle and approved by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles.

(2) The registration plate number of the replacement vehicle shall be the same as for the original licensed vehicle.

(3) An affidavit shall be filed with the Village Clerk certifying that the permit displayed on the original vehicle had been destroyed at the time of disposition.

C. Leased vehicles. A permit may be issued to a village resident for use on a leased vehicle under the following terms and conditions:

(1) The application shall be accompanied by a sworn statement of the lessor and lessee that the vehicle is leased for the entire term of the licensing period.

(2) A sworn statement by the lessee that the vehicle is for the exclusive use of the resident applicant and will be garaged at the applicant's village residence.

(3) The license shall be issued in the name of the village resident and he shall be liable for any improper use of said license.

§ 237-36. Display of permit.

The Commissioner of Police and Public Safety is authorized and required to designate the part or parts of a vehicle upon which the permit shall or may be displayed, and the manner in which it shall or may be displayed. Such designations may be by order, rule or regulation, and a brief indication of such designation shall appear upon each permit issued pursuant to this article.

§ 237-37. Loss of permit.

In case of loss or destruction of any permit issued pursuant to this article, the owner may obtain a replacement by filing an application with the Village Clerk in such form as the Clerk shall provide, and paying the required fee which shall be set by the Village Board. Such application shall set forth that the permit was lost or destroyed. After the issuance, pursuant to this section, of a replacement permit, the replaced permit shall no longer be valid.

§ 237-38. Violations.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this article, for any person to do any of the following acts:

A. To transfer or assign any license issued pursuant to this article.

B. To cause, allow or permit the display of a license issued pursuant to this article upon any vehicle registered in his name or of which he is the operator, unless it is a licensed vehicle.

C. To remove a license issued pursuant to this article from any licensed vehicle without the permission of the owner.

D. To alter or deface a license issued pursuant to this article, unless a still-valid license for said vehicle has been issued pursuant to this article.

E. To allow or permit any vehicle, other than a licensed vehicle, registered in the name of or operated by such person to stand or be parked in any parking spaces or parking areas designated pursuant to this article as "Restricted to Licensed Vehicles."

§ 237-39. Parking in municipal parking lot.

A. The Commissioner of Police and Public Safety is authorized and required to designate by suitable signs and markings, parking spaces in the municipal parking lot maintained by the village between Scally Place and Union Avenue in the village, said parking space to be designated "Restricted to Licensed Commuter Vehicles." All other parking space in the aforesaid municipal parking lot shall be designated by suitable signs and markings.

B. The Commissioner of Police and Public Safety is authorized and required to designate by suitable signs and markings, parking spaces in the municipal parking lots maintained by the village. Said parking space to be designated "Licensed Business Vehicles Parking Permitted." All other parking space in the aforesaid municipal parking lot shall be designated by suitable signs and markings. Vehicles with a properly issued valid business parking license may park in the following locations:

- (1) Belmont Avenue Field #2. All areas except meters located on Eastern side of lot.
- (2) Madison Avenue Field #3. Entire lot.
- (3) Schenk Avenue Field #4. Entire lot.
- (4) Drexel Avenue Field #5. Entire lot.
- (5) Maple Avenue Field #6. Western side of lot only.

ARTICLE V
Municipal Parking Lots

§ 237-40. Designation.

The following areas are designated as municipal parking lots:

Number	Name
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- No. 1 Scally Place Parking Field
- No. 2 Belmont Avenue Parking Field
- No. 3 Madison Street Parking Field
- No. 4 Schenck Avenue Parking Field
- No. 5 Drexel Avenue Parking Field
- No. 6 Maple Avenue Parking Field

§ 237-41. Trucks and trailers excluded.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive, park, stand, load or unload any truck or trailer in or upon any municipal parking lot, or to cause or to allow any truck or trailer owned by him or under his control to park, stand, load, unload, be driven or be in or upon any municipal parking lot.

§ 237-42. Motor vehicles held or offered for sale or repair excluded.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive, park or stand any motor vehicle held or offered for sale or repair or service in the course of his business or that of his employer in or upon any municipal parking lot, or to cause or to allow any such motor vehicle owned by him or under his control to park, stand, be driven or be in or upon any municipal parking lot.

§ 237-43. Parking limited to twenty-four hours.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park or stand any motor vehicle in or upon any municipal parking lot for a period of more than 24 hours, or to cause or to allow any motor vehicle owned by him or under his control to park, stand or be in or upon any municipal parking lot for a period of more than 24 hours.

§ 237-44. Parking across lines or markings unlawful.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this chapter for any person to park any vehicle across any line or marking on the pavement or surface of a municipal parking field designating a parking space, or in such position that the wheels of the

vehicle shall not be parked entirely within the area designated for parking by such lines or markings.

ARTICLE VI
Parking Meters

§ 237-45. Establishment of parking zones.

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and directed to immediately establish zones, to be known as "parking meter zones," in the following parking fields, streets and avenues: Madison Street Parking Field, Belmont Avenue Parking Field, Schenck Avenue Parking Field, Butler Street Parking Field, Winthrop Street Parking Field and part of Scally Place Parking Field, and all streets fronting on property zoned for business use and/or industrial use throughout the Incorporated Village of Westbury, and from time to time thereafter as traffic conditions require in such other streets, avenues and parking fields as are selected by resolution of the Village of Westbury for the location of such zones.

§ 237-46. Designation of parking meters.

The Board of Trustees is hereby directed and authorized to mark off individual parking spaces in the parking zones designated and described in § 237-45 and in such other zones as shall hereafter be established; and parking spaces shall be designated by lines painted or durably marked on the curbing or the surface of the street. At each space so marked off it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in such a way that said vehicle shall not be entirely within the limits of the space so designated.

§ 237-47. Installation of parking meters.

A. The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and directed to cause parking meters to be installed either upon the curb or sidewalk immediately adjacent to the parking spaces set off in the parking meter zones or within said designated space.

B. Each parking meter shall be so set as to display the signal showing legal parking by the deposit of an appropriate coin or coins for the period of time as set forth on such meter. Each parking meter shall be so arranged that at the expiration of the lawful time limit, it will indicate by a proper visible signal that the lawful parking period has

expired, and in such cases the right of an operator of a vehicle to occupy such space shall cease and the operator thereof shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter provided.

§ 237-48. Control and supervision of parking meters.

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and directed to provide for operation, maintenance, supervision, regulation and use of the parking meters provided for in this ordinance and to maintain said meters in good workable condition.

§ 237-49. Operation of parking meters.

Except in case of emergency determined by an officer of the Police Department, or in compliance with the direction of a police officer, when any vehicle shall be parked in any parking space along side of or next to which a parking meter is located, the operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering the said parking meter space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited in said meter such proper coin of the United States as is required by such parking meter and as is designated on such meter, and the failure to deposit such proper coin and to set the timing mechanism in operation shall constitute a violation of this ordinance. Upon the deposit of such coin and the setting of the timing mechanism in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle for the period of time which has been prescribed for that part of the street in which such parking space is located, provided that any person placing a vehicle in a parking meter space adjacent to a meter which indicates that unused time has been left in the meter by the previous occupant of such space shall not be required to deposit a coin so long as his occupancy does not exceed the indicated unused parking time. If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limit set for such parking space, and if the meter shall indicate such illegal parking, then, and in that event, such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime and beyond the period of legal parking time and such parking shall be deemed a violation of this article.

§ 237-50. Parking time limits and fees.

It is hereby reserved to the Board of Trustees, by resolution at a regular public meeting, to set forth the various time limits and fees for lawful parking and standing

of motor vehicles in designated spaces at parking meters.

§ 237-51. Violations.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this article and any regulations adopted under the authority granted by § 237-50 for any person:

A. To cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of or operated by such person to be parked overtime or beyond the period of legal parking time established for any parking meter zone as herein described, or to deposit in any parking meter any coin for the purpose of parking beyond the maximum legal parking time for the particular parking meter zone.

B. To permit any vehicle to remain in any parking space adjacent to any parking meter beyond the time limit set for such parking space and while said meter is displaying a signal indicating that the vehicle occupying such parking space has already been parked beyond the period prescribed for such parking space.

C. To park any vehicle across any line or marking of a parking meter space or in such a position that the vehicle shall not be entirely within the area designated by such lines or markings.

D. To deface, injure, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this article.

E. To deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, device or metal substance or any object other than a lawful coin.

§ 237-52. Unmetered parking.

Such portions of the Madison Street parking field, Belmont Avenue parking field and Scally Place parking field as shall be designated by signs may be utilized for the unmetered parking of motor vehicles for a period of time as set by the Board of Trustees by resolution.

§ 237-53. Uses of fees.

The specified coin, coins or tokens required to be deposited

in parking meters as provided herein are hereby levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation and control of traffic upon the public streets, and also the cost of supervising and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking meter zones created hereby, and cover the cost of purchasing, acquiring, installation, operation, maintenance, supervision, regulation and control of the parking meters described herein.

ARTICLE VII
Snow Emergencies

§ 237-54. Legislative intent.

It is hereby declared and found vital to the public welfare and safety of the residents of the village and the general public that this local law be enacted to regulate and control traffic, to prevent traffic congestion, to expedite the orderly flow of traffic and emergency vehicles and to facilitate removal of snow from village streets and highways during periods of snow emergency.

§ 237-55. Existence of snow emergency.

A snow emergency shall exist whenever there shall be an accumulation of snow exceeding 2 ½ inches (6.35 centimeters) in depth as measured at the official snow gauge to be provided and maintained by the Superintendent of Public Works at such location within the Village as he, in his discretion, may determine.

§ 237-56. Notice of snow emergency.

The presence on any street or highway within the village of an accumulation of snow to a depth exceeding 2 ½ inches (6.35 centimeters) shall be deemed notice to all operators of motor vehicles stopping, standing or parking such vehicles on such street or highway that the snow emergency parking regulations set forth in this article are in effect at such time and place, and it shall be presumed that such motor vehicle operators have actual notice of the existence of a snow emergency by reason of such snow accumulation.

§ 237-57. Duration of snow emergency.

A snow emergency shall remain in effect for a period of 72

hours after it commences unless sooner declared terminated by the Mayor or Commissioner of Police and Public Safety or their delegate.

§ 237-58. Erection and maintenance of signs.

The Commissioner of Police and Public Safety shall cause to be posted, erected and maintained during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April of each year appropriate signs at street locations clearly visible to all vehicles entering the village by all major streets, at or near the village boundary, to provide notice of the parking, stopping and standing regulations that shall be in effect during snow emergencies as defined in § 237-55 of this article. The type, number and location of such signs shall be determined by the Commissioner.

§ 237-59. Parking, stopping and standing regulations.

During a snow emergency as defined in § 237-55 of this article, the following parking, stopping and standing regulations shall apply:

A. No person shall park a vehicle or permit the same to stand on any street or highway within the Village during any part of the twenty-four-hour period commencing at 8:00 a.m. or such later hour as a snow emergency commences and continuing until 8:00 a.m. of the following day, on those days of each week as hereinafter specified:

(1) On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays on that side of the street or highway having buildings fronting thereon that are designated by odd-numbered street addresses.

(2) On Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays on that side of each street having buildings fronting thereon that are designated by even-numbered street addresses.

B. No person shall park a vehicle, but may stop the same temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers, on any street within that part thereof extending 35 feet distant, as measured along the curblines, from any intersecting street.

C. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this article for a person to leave a vehicle parked or abandoned or left unattended where same constitutes an obstruction to the movement of traffic or at any place where stopping, standing

or parking is prohibited in the Village.

D. At those locations where parking, stopping or standing is prohibited and signs giving notice of such prohibition are posted, such prohibition shall continue in effect during periods of snow emergency, notwithstanding the provisions of Subsections A and B. All other parking, stopping or standing regulations in conflict with the provisions of Subsections A and B of this section are suspended and superseded during periods of snow emergency as herein defined.

E. The snow emergency regulations set forth in Subsections A and B of this section shall apply only to those streets and highways maintained by the village, except Railroad Avenue, and shall not apply to streets and highways maintained by the state, county or town governments, including, specifically, but not limited thereto by reason of specification, the following streets and highways: Jericho Turnpike (Route 25), Brush Hollow Road, Maple Avenue, Old Country Road, Post Avenue, Union Avenue and Westbury Avenue.

§ 237-60. Snow emergency routes.

The Commissioner of Police and Public Safety is hereby empowered and authorized to designate certain streets and highways within the village as snow emergency routes and to cause to be erected and maintained thereon appropriate signs at reasonable intervals along such snow emergency routes to provide notice that parking, stopping, standing or abandonment of vehicles along such snow emergency routes during a snow emergency is prohibited, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park, stop, stand or abandon a vehicle on a street so designated and signed as a snow emergency route during a snow emergency as herein defined.

§ 237-61. Enforcement; penalties for offenses.

The provisions of Article VIII of this chapter, entitled "Removal and Storage of Vehicles," shall apply to any vehicle that is parked, stopped, standing or abandoned on any street or highway within the Village in violation of this Article VII. Any person violating this article shall be guilty of a traffic infraction, and every person convicted of a violation thereof shall be liable to be punished by a fine or imprisonment or both in accordance with § 237-66. of this chapter.

ARTICLE VIII
Removal and Storage of Vehicles

§ 237-62. Authority to remove and impound vehicles.

The Department of Public Works is hereby authorized and empowered to remove and impound any vehicle that is:

A. Parked or abandoned on any highway or in any municipal parking lot within this Village during a snowstorm, flood, fire or other public emergency which affects that portion of the highway or municipal parking lot upon which said vehicle is parked or abandoned.

B. Found unattended on any highway or in any municipal parking lot within this Village where such vehicle is an obstruction to traffic.

C. Parked or abandoned on any highway or in any municipal parking lot within this Village where stopping, standing or parking is prohibited or is in violation of the provisions of this chapter.

D. Parked in Municipal Parking Lot No. 1 (Sally Place Parking Field) in a space designated by sign for permit parking only, without a valid parking permit issued by this Village, pursuant to Article IV, § 237-35 of this Code, displayed and affixed to such vehicle in the manner specified by the Commissioner of Police and Public Safety.

§ 237-63. Storage and charges.

After removal of any vehicle as provided in this article, the Department of Public Works may store such vehicle in a suitable place at the expense of the owner. Such owner or person in charge of the vehicle may redeem the same upon payment to the Village Clerk of the amount of all expenses actually and necessarily incurred in effecting such removal, together with such charges as may have accrued as a result of storage of the vehicle, the Board of Trustees hereby is authorized to fix, by resolution, from time to time, the charges for such removal, impounding and storage of vehicles, including towing charges, storage and administrative costs.

§ 237-64. Notice of removal.

The Department of Public Works shall, without delay, report to the Village Clerk the removal and the disposition of any

vehicle removed as provided in this article; and it shall be the duty of Village Clerk to ascertain, to the extent possible, the owner of the vehicle or person having same in charge, and to notify him of the removal and disposition of such vehicle and of the amount which will be required to redeem same.

ARTICLE IX
Miscellaneous Provisions

§ 237-65. Regulation of training vehicles.

A. Identification required. Training vehicles to bear signs. All training vehicles shall have painted on each side, in letters not less than two inches high, the words "Student Driver Training" and a white sign bearing the same words in black letters at least three inches high shall be displayed upon the front and rear bumpers of each such vehicles.

B. Dual controls required. All training vehicles shall be equipped with dual controls which enable the instructor to steer or stop the car.

C. Penalties. It shall be a violation of the provisions of this section:

(1) For any person to drive or to cause or permit to be driven upon any highways as a training vehicle any training vehicle which he owns or controls and which does not conform to the requirements of this section.

(2) For any person to give instruction for hire in the driving or operation of a motor vehicle upon any highway in a training vehicle which does not conform to the requirements of this section.

§ 237-66. Penalties for offenses.

Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this chapter which is not a violation of any provision of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within eighteen (18) months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen

(15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ARTICLE X
Schedules

§ 237-67. Schedule I: Traffic Control Signals.

In accordance with the provisions of § 237-4, traffic control signals shall be installed at the following described intersections:


